The District

As a high-performing school district known throughout the Midwest for academic excellence that defines innovation and delivers value, the Mason City Schools are a “draw” for both families and businesses. Mason City Schools educate over 10,000 students in an early childhood center, (PK, K, 1, 2), two elementary schools (2, 3 and 4-6), a middle school (7-8), and high school (9-12). MHS students lead and learn through 26 AP courses, College Credit Plus, a student-run bank, a student-run store, a student-run website, internships, community service, 70 school-sanctioned extracurriculars, 67 athletic teams, and award-winning band, orchestra, arts, choral and drama programs. For career education programs, students may attend the Great Oaks Institute of Technology and Career Development.

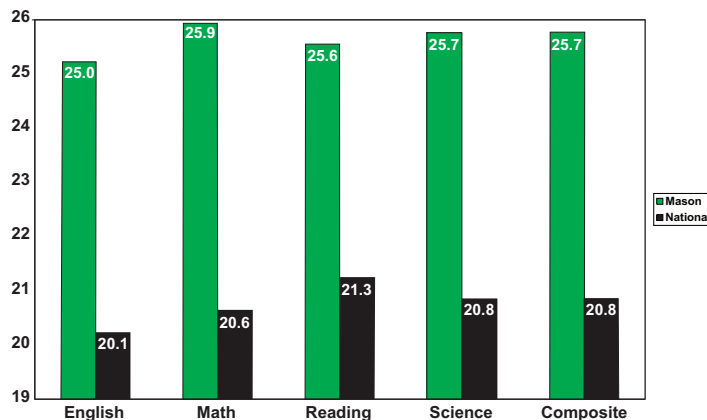

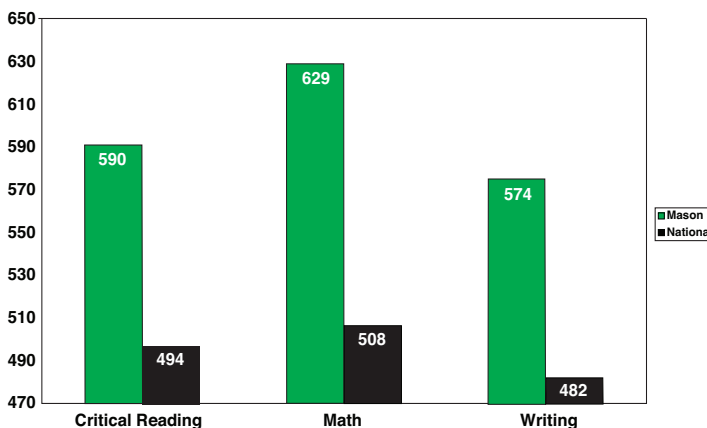
In 2017, a total of 24 AP courses were offered. AP courses represent the highest-level course offered in each discipline.

- 2011-12:** 705 students took 1200 AP exams, 90.6% scoring a 3 or higher.
2012-13: 801 students took 1471 AP exams, 91.6% scoring a 3 or higher.
2013-14: 928 students took 1785 AP exams, 88.2% scoring a 3 or higher.
2014-15: 1102 students took 2142 AP exams, 85.8% scoring a 3 or higher.
2015-16: 1184 students took 2328 AP exams, 84.5% scoring a 3 or higher.
2016-17: 1287 students took 2689 AP exams, 86.4% scoring a 3 or higher.
